Contraceptive Security Index

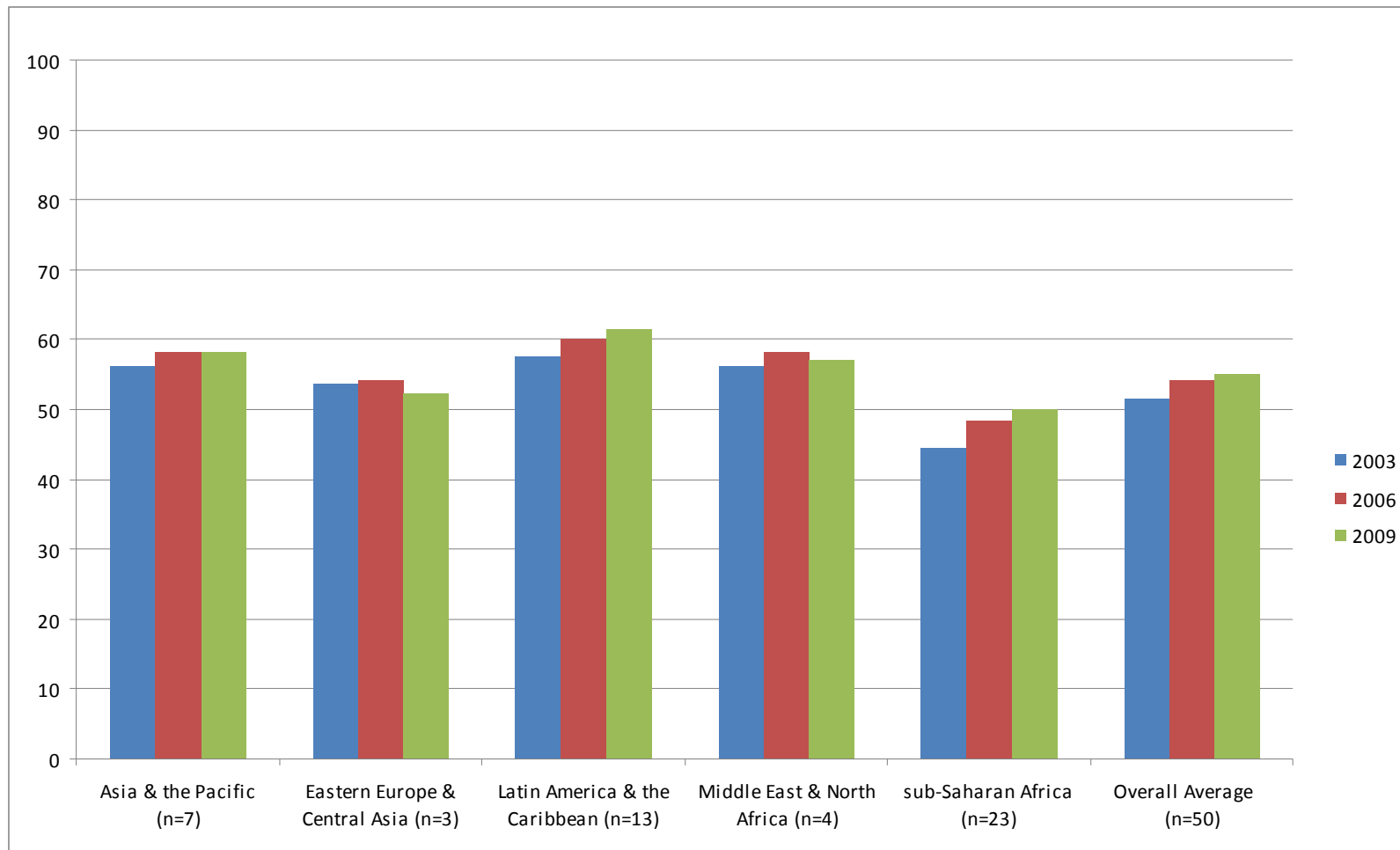
- Tool to raise awareness, support advocacy, focus priorities, monitor progress for CS
- Evaluates 60 countries
- 5 components, 17 indicators
 - Supply chain (logistics)
 - Financing
 - Health and social environment
 - Access
 - Utilization
- Analysis of CS over time
 - Now have three evaluation points, 2003, 2006 and 2009

CS Index Total Scores by Region (2003, 2006, 2009)

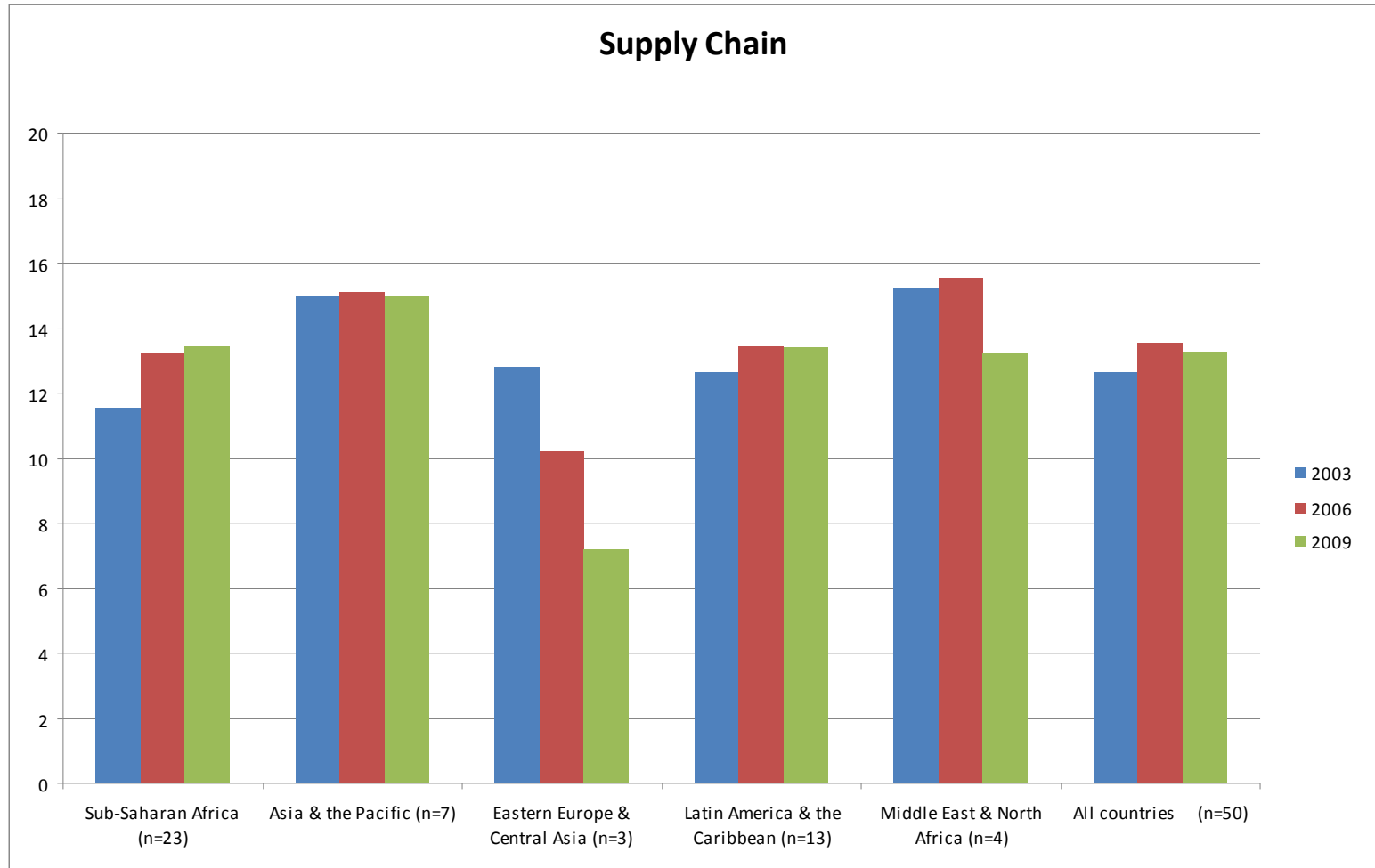

CS Index – Supply Chain (2003, 2006, 2009)

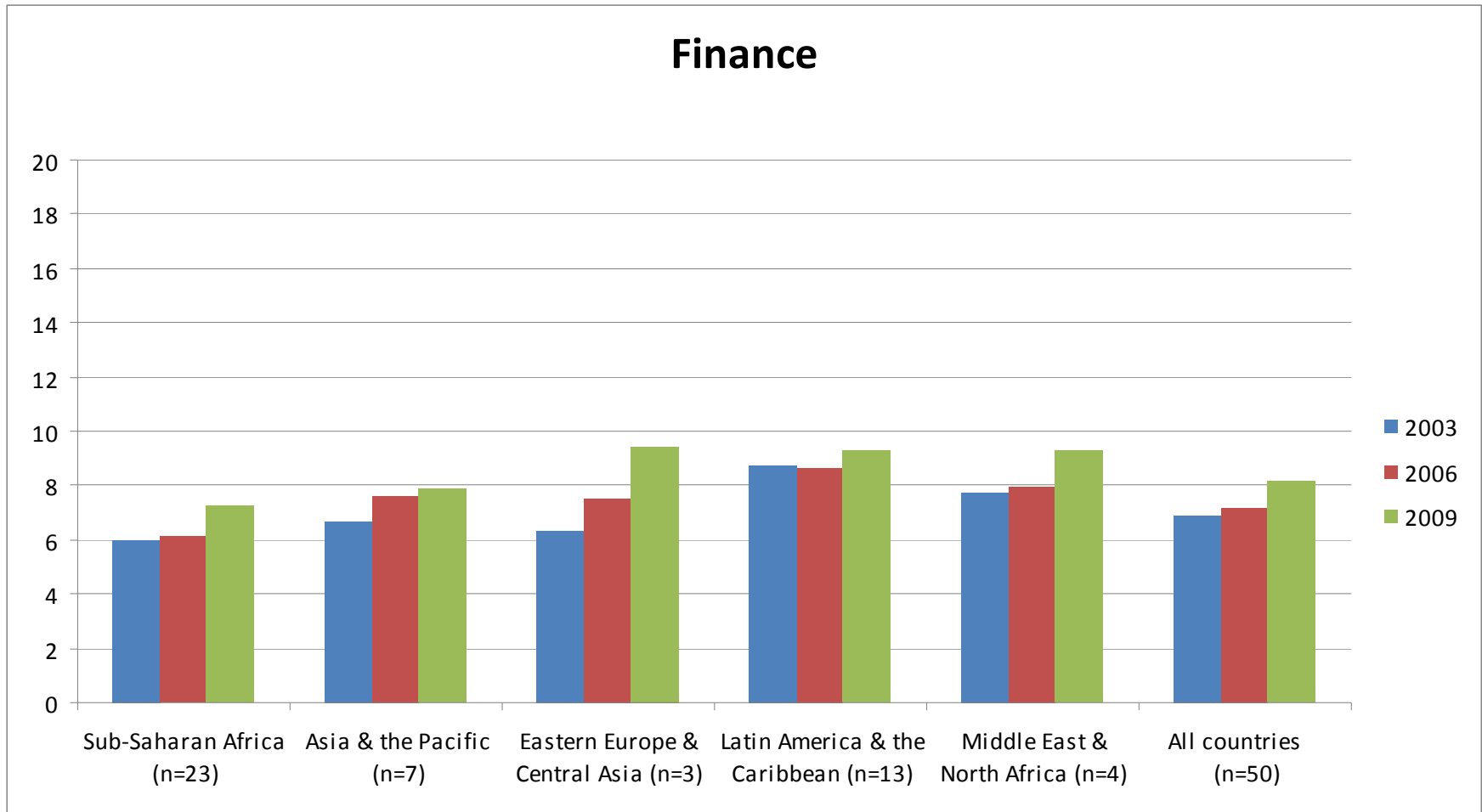

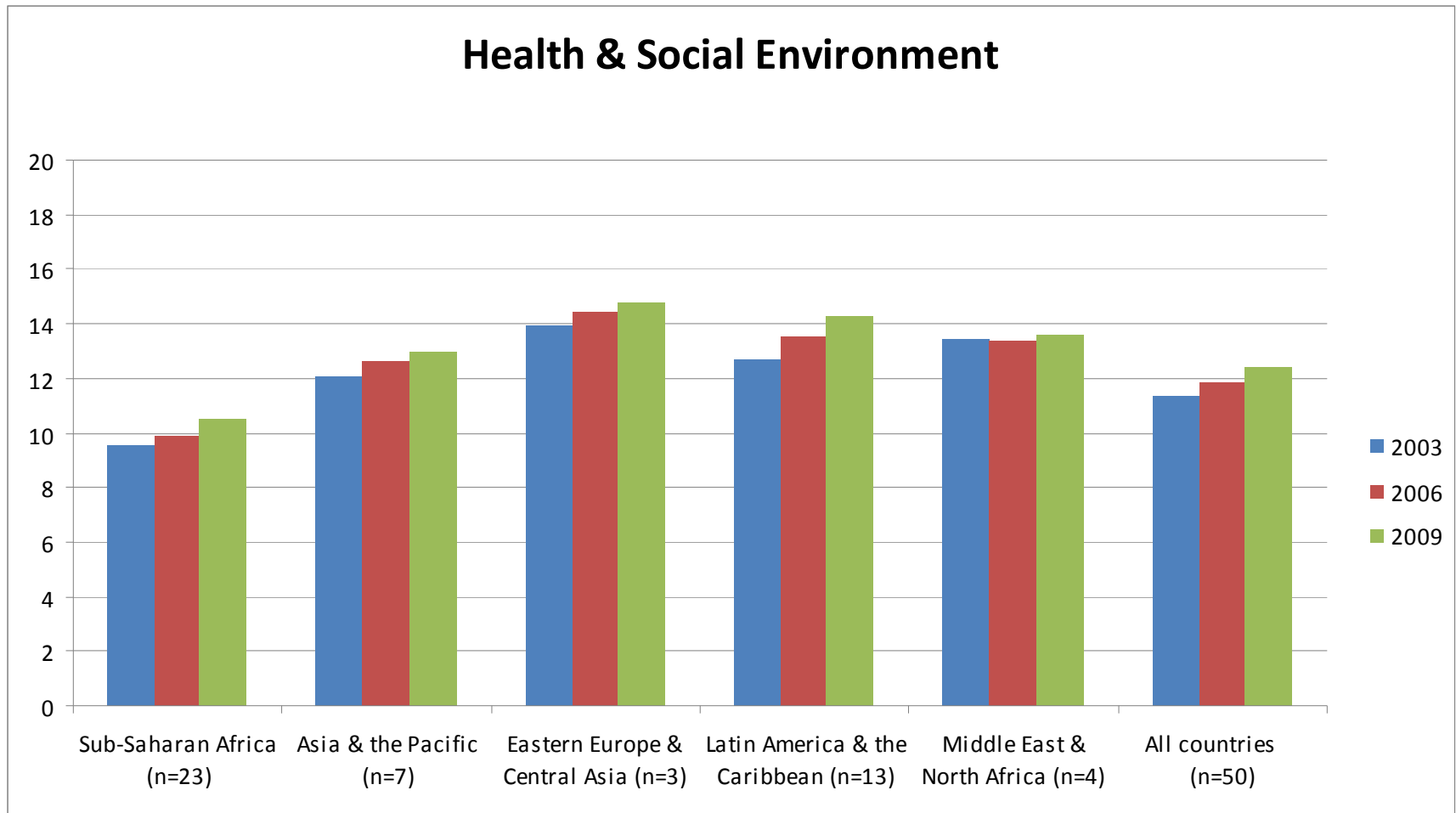
CS Index – Finance (2003, 2006, 2009)

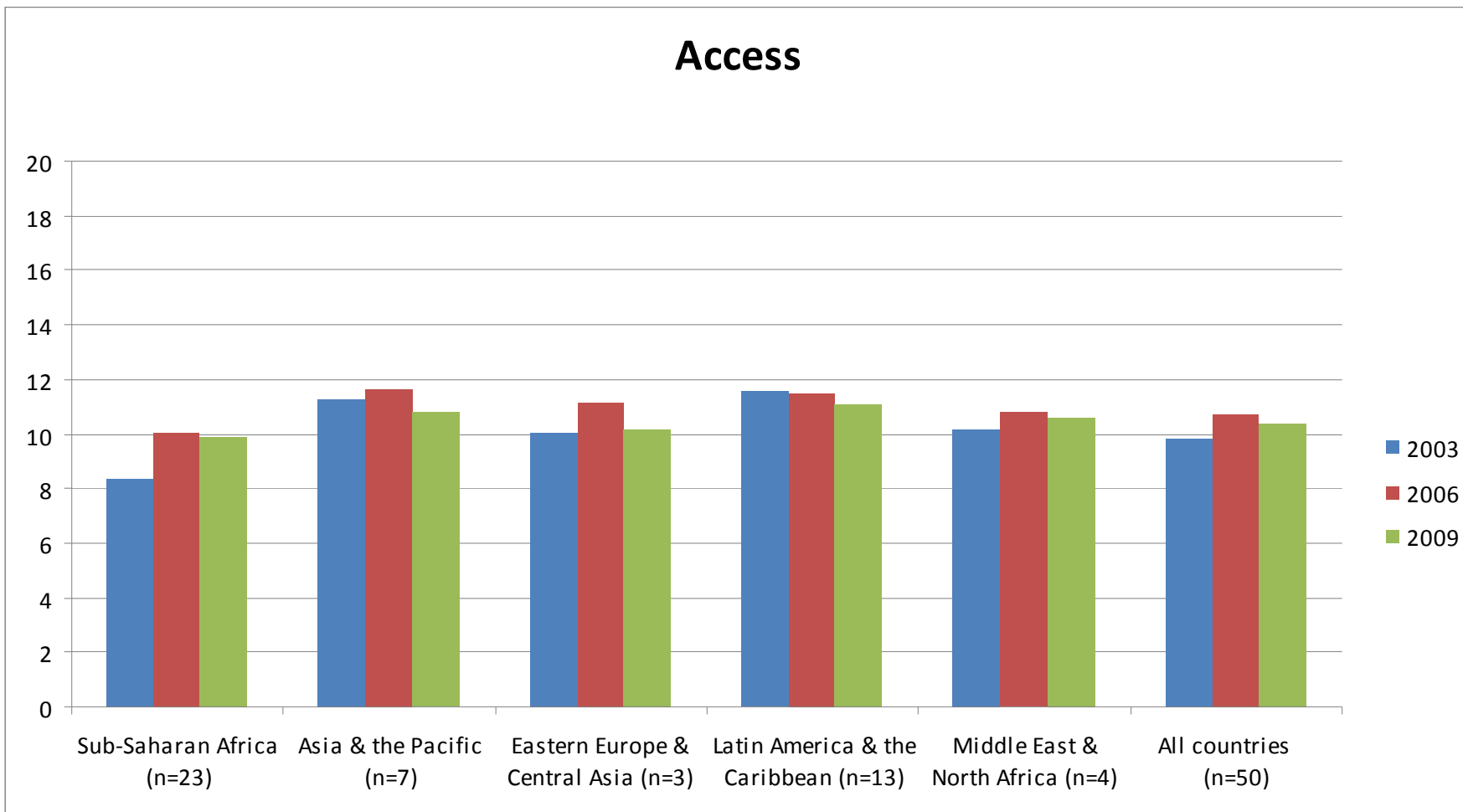

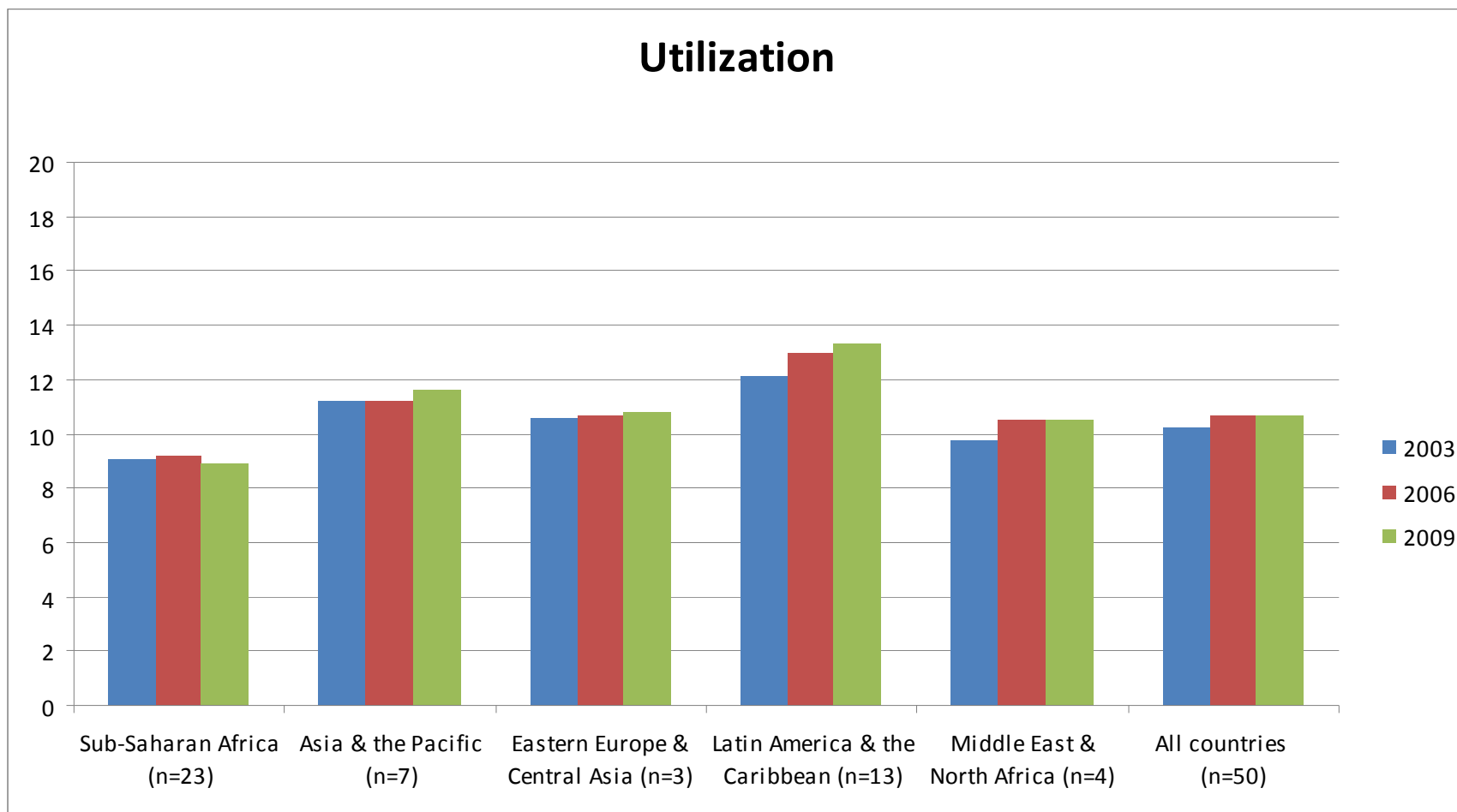
