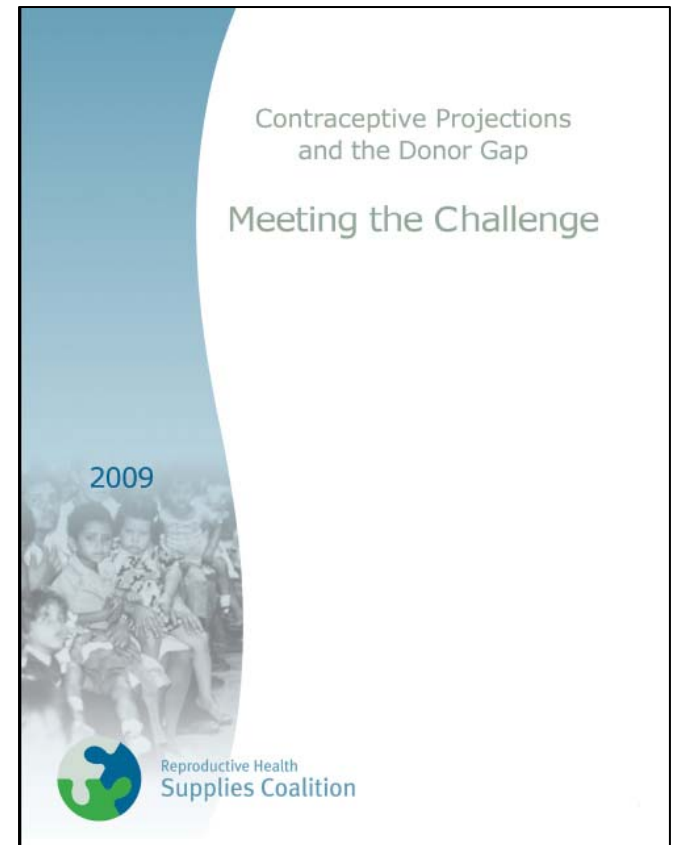

# Purpose

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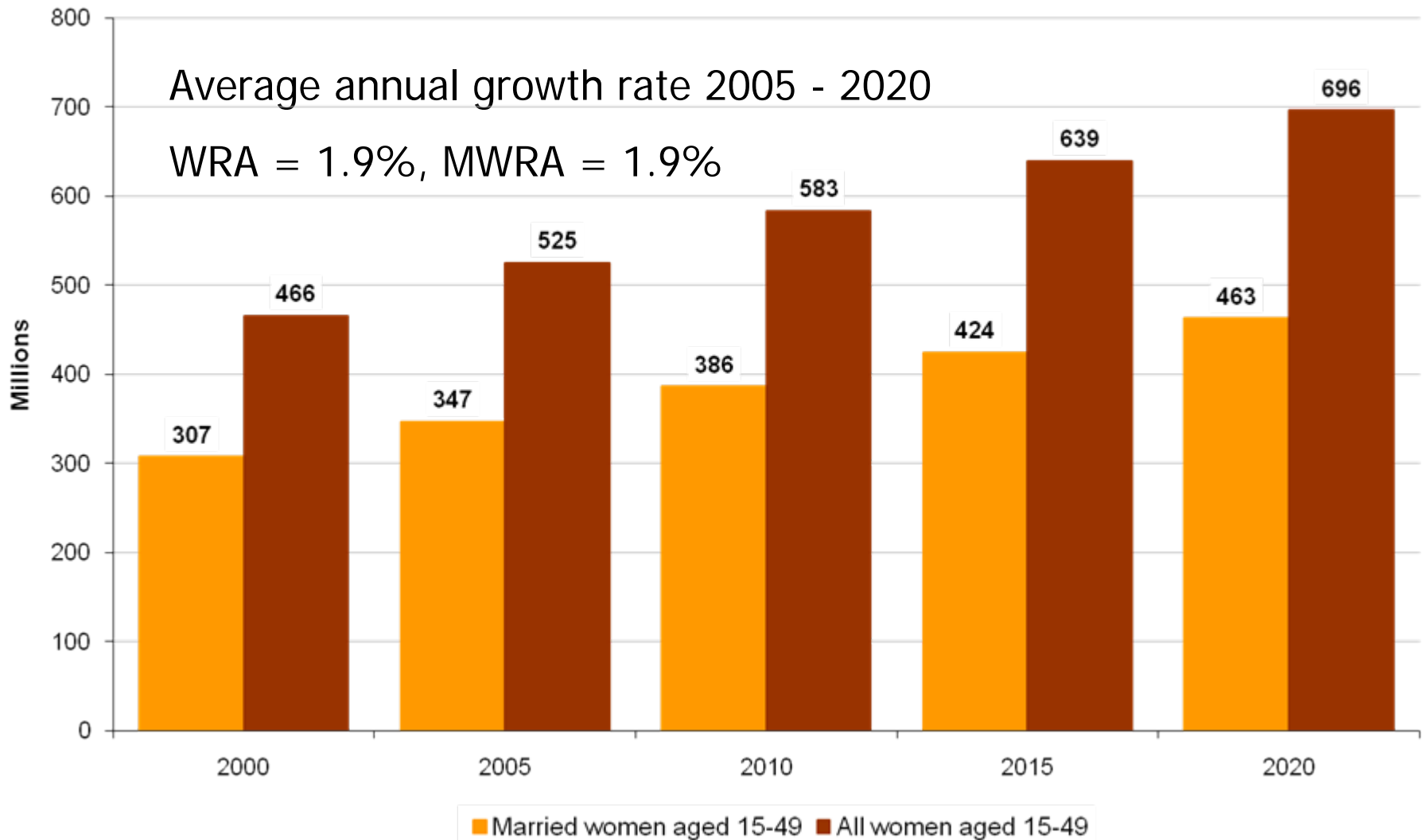
- Support efforts to mobilize donor funding for contraceptives

# Countries in the Analysis

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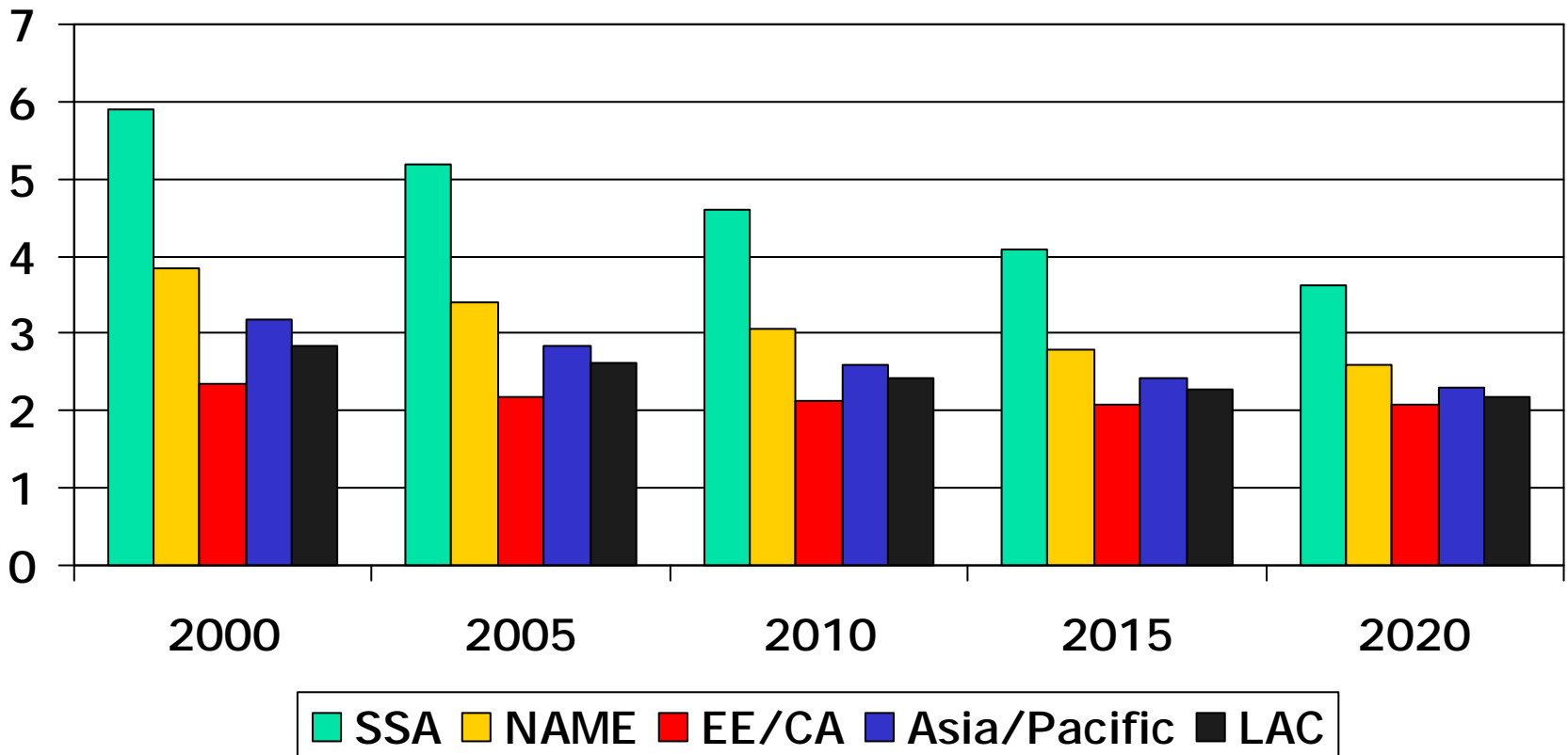
- 88 low and middle income countries dependent on donors for contraceptive supplies
- Includes all countries over one million population except
  - Sub-Saharan Africa: South Africa
  - Asia/Pacific: China, DPR Korea, India, Thailand
  - NAME: Libya, Turkey
  - LAC: Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Uruguay, Venezuela
- EE/CA: Includes only Romania and CARs

**Figure 1. Number of All Women and Married Women (15-49)**

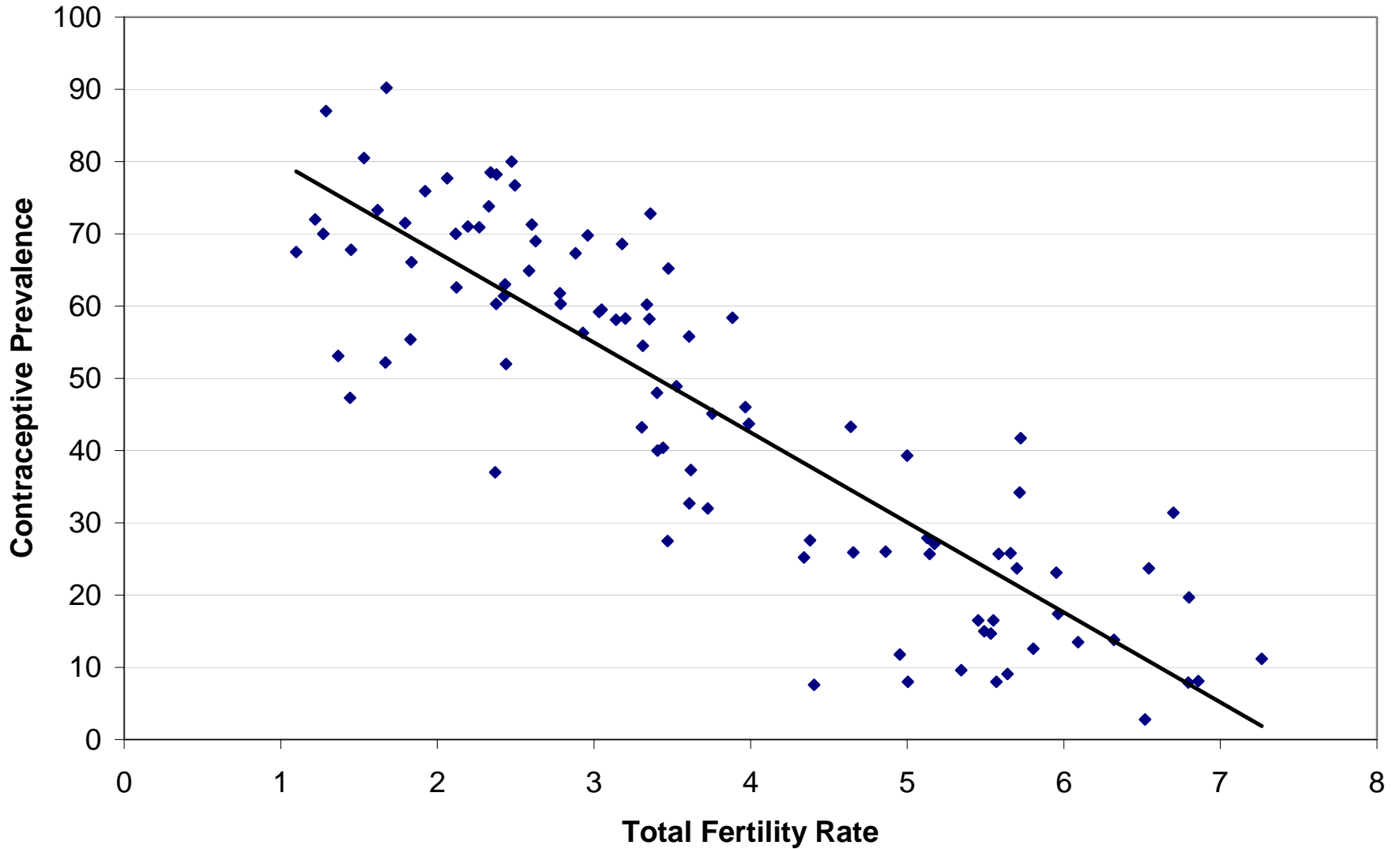

Medium Variant Scenario**

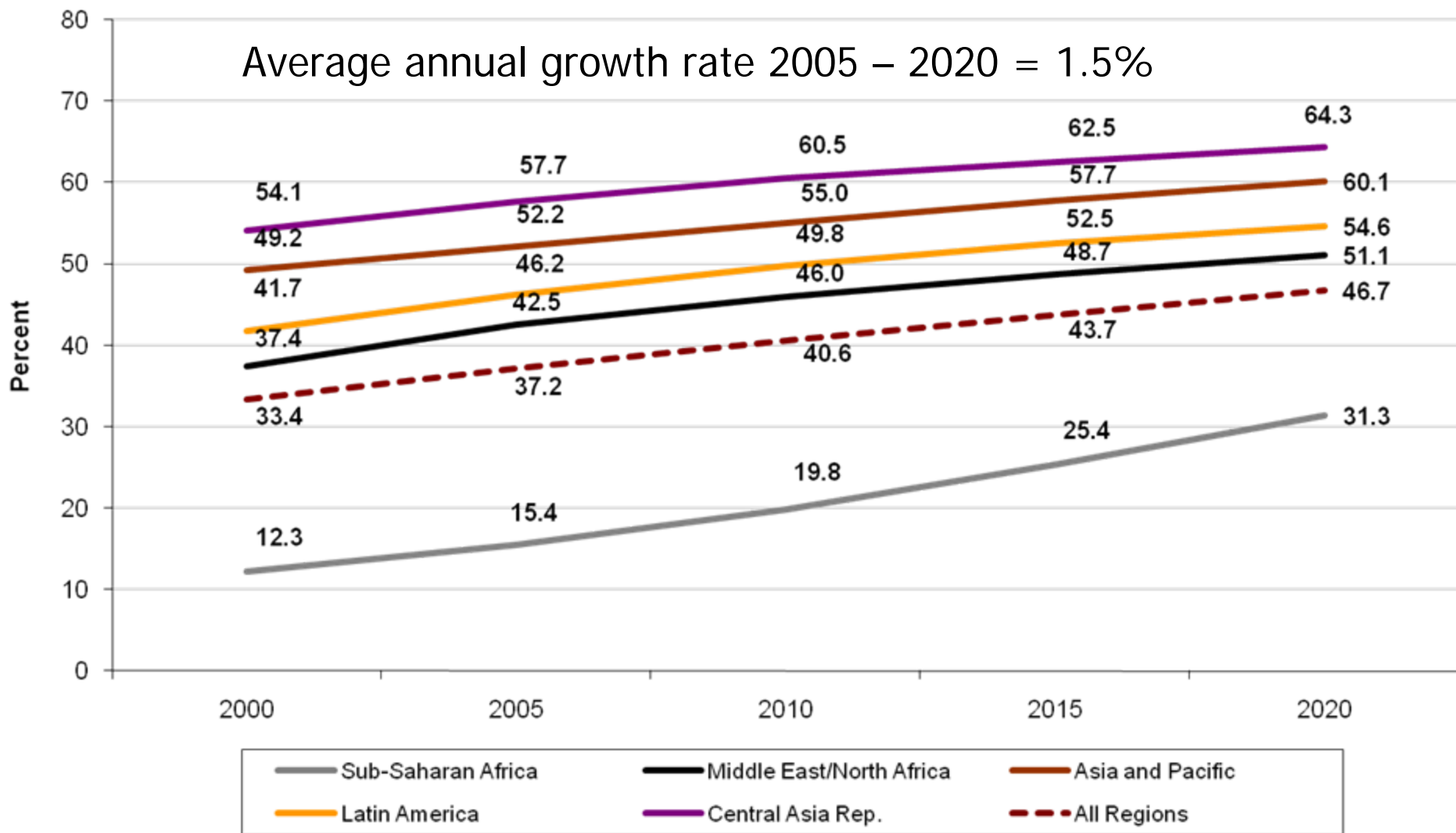
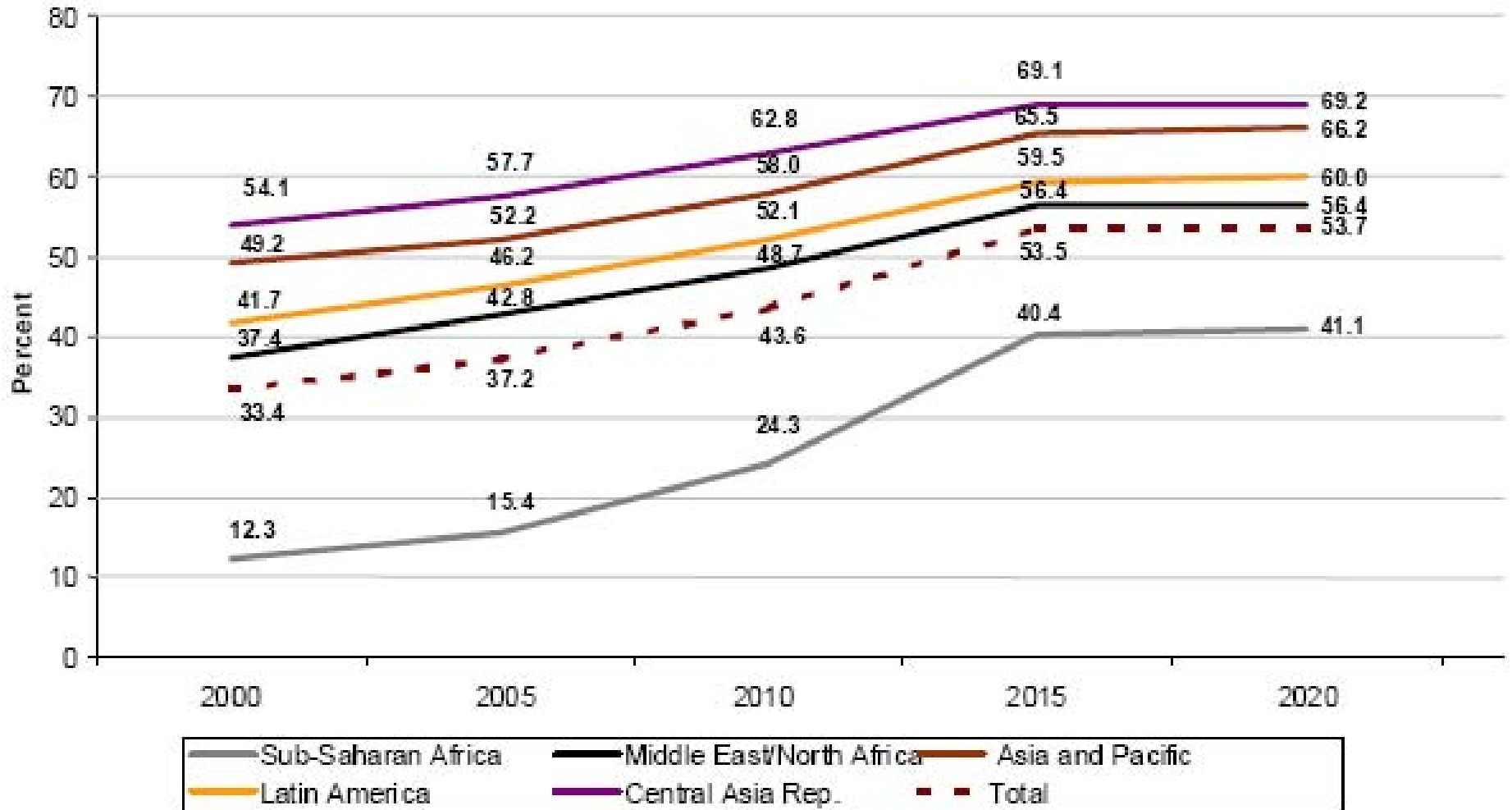
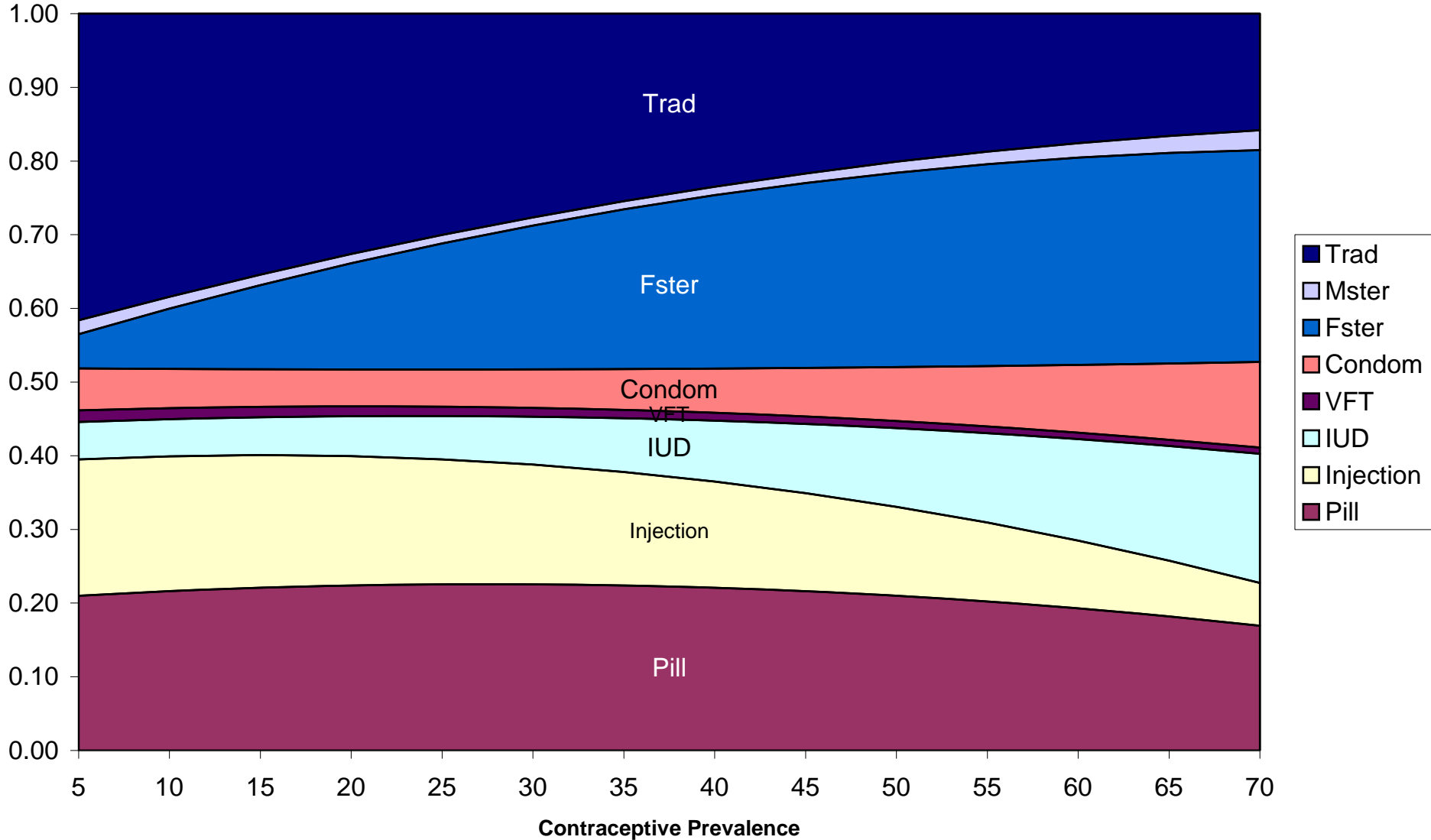


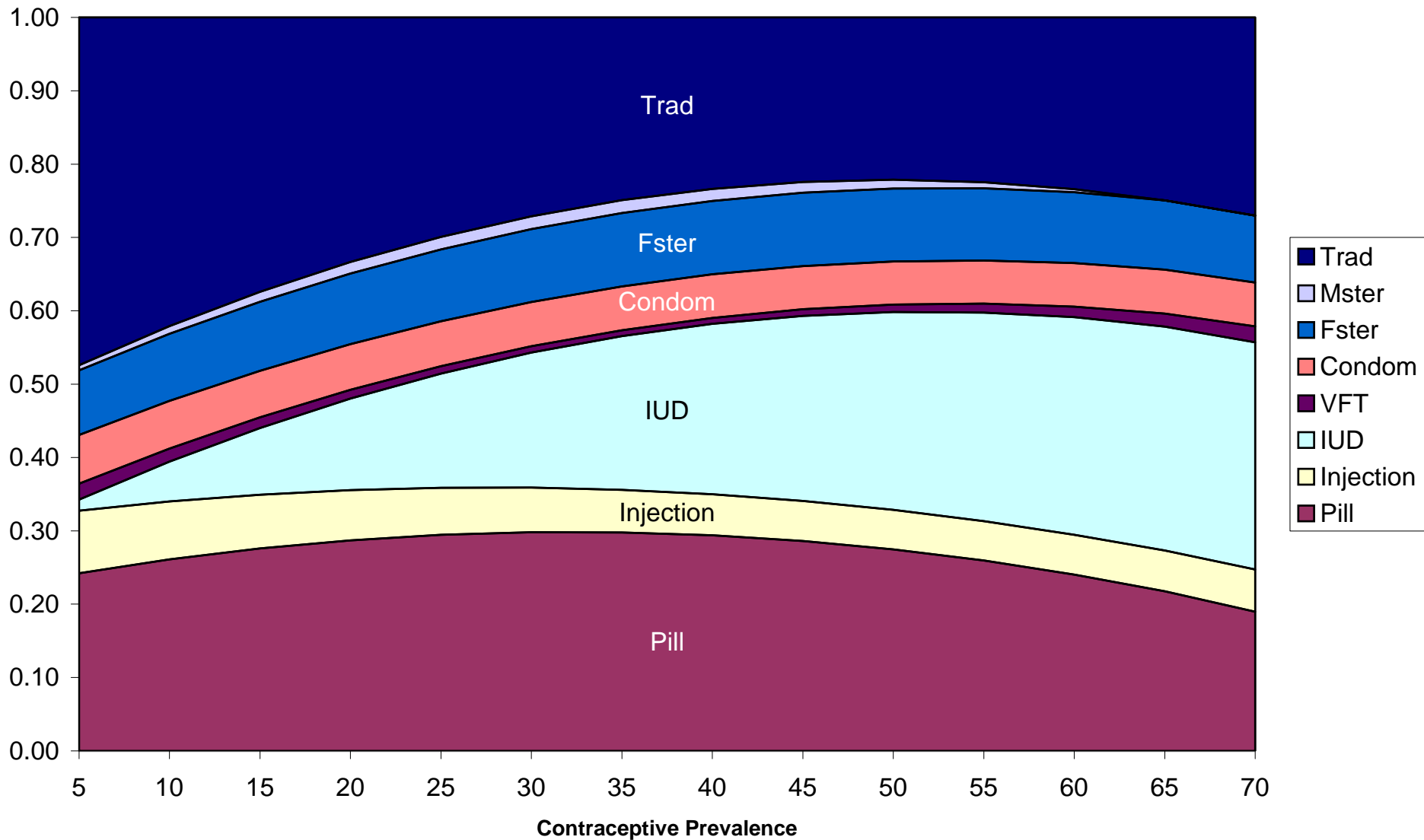
Figure 3b. Contraceptive Prevalence for Modern Method Methods Among Married Women 15-49 by Region  
Unmet Need Scenario



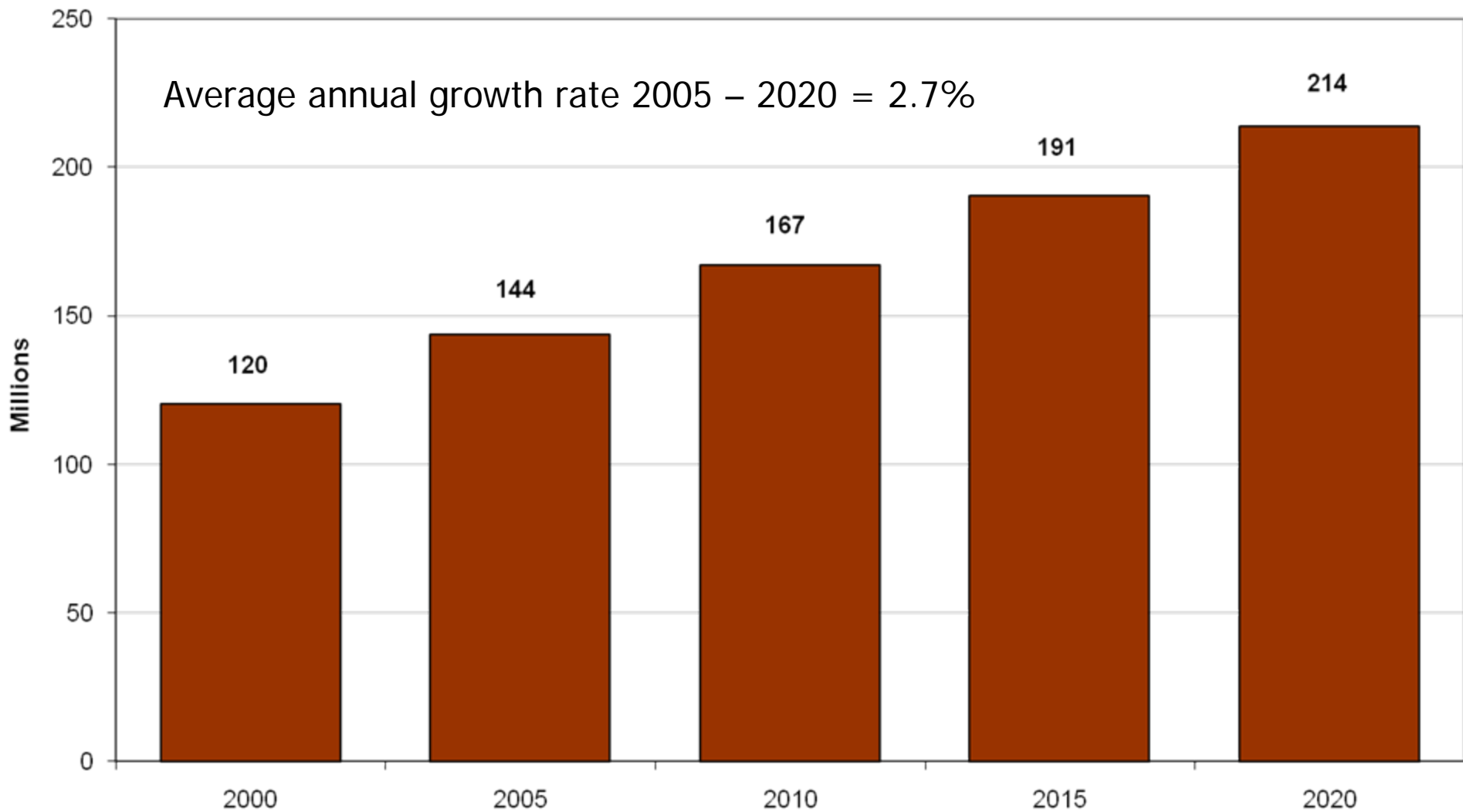

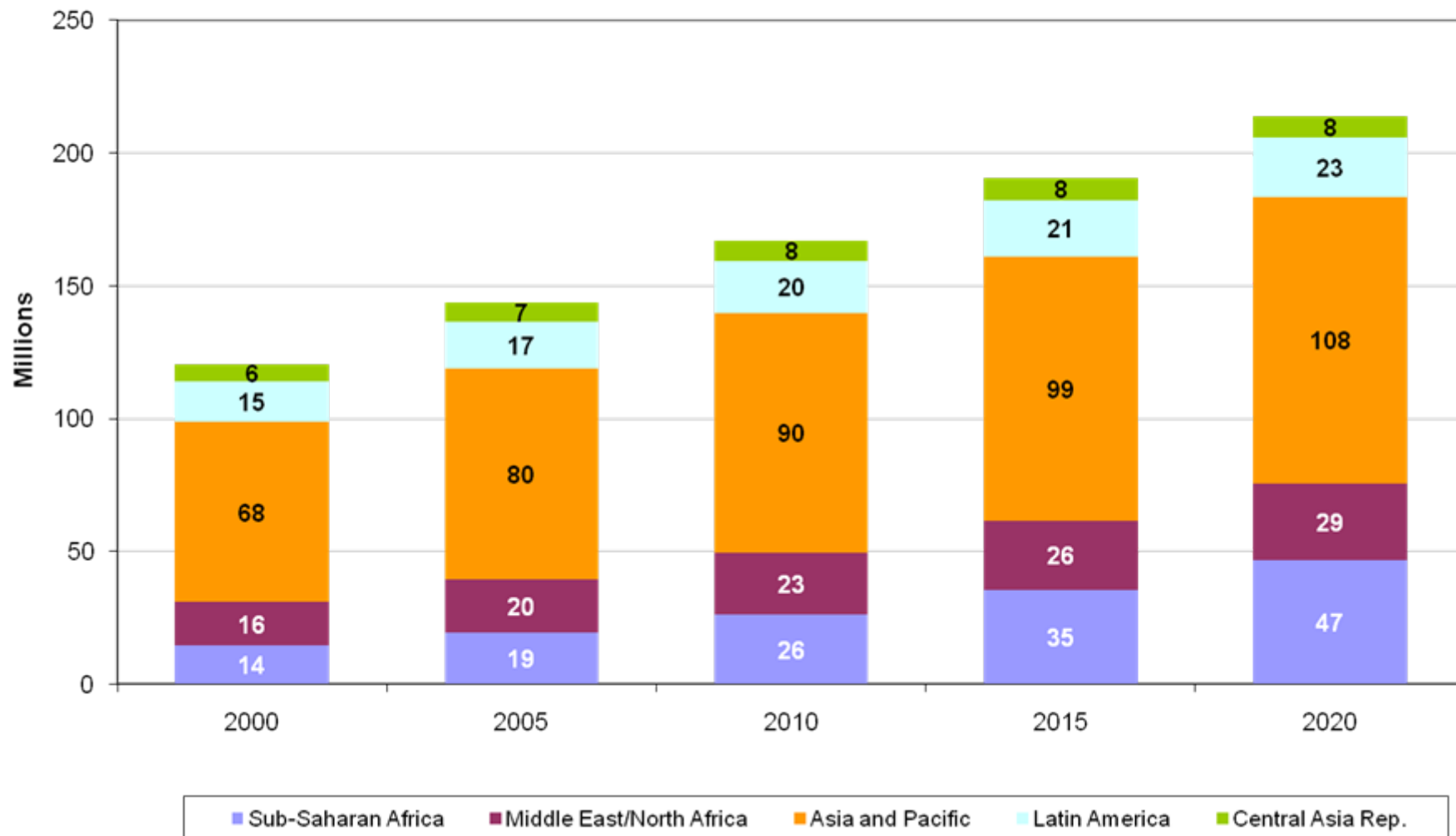

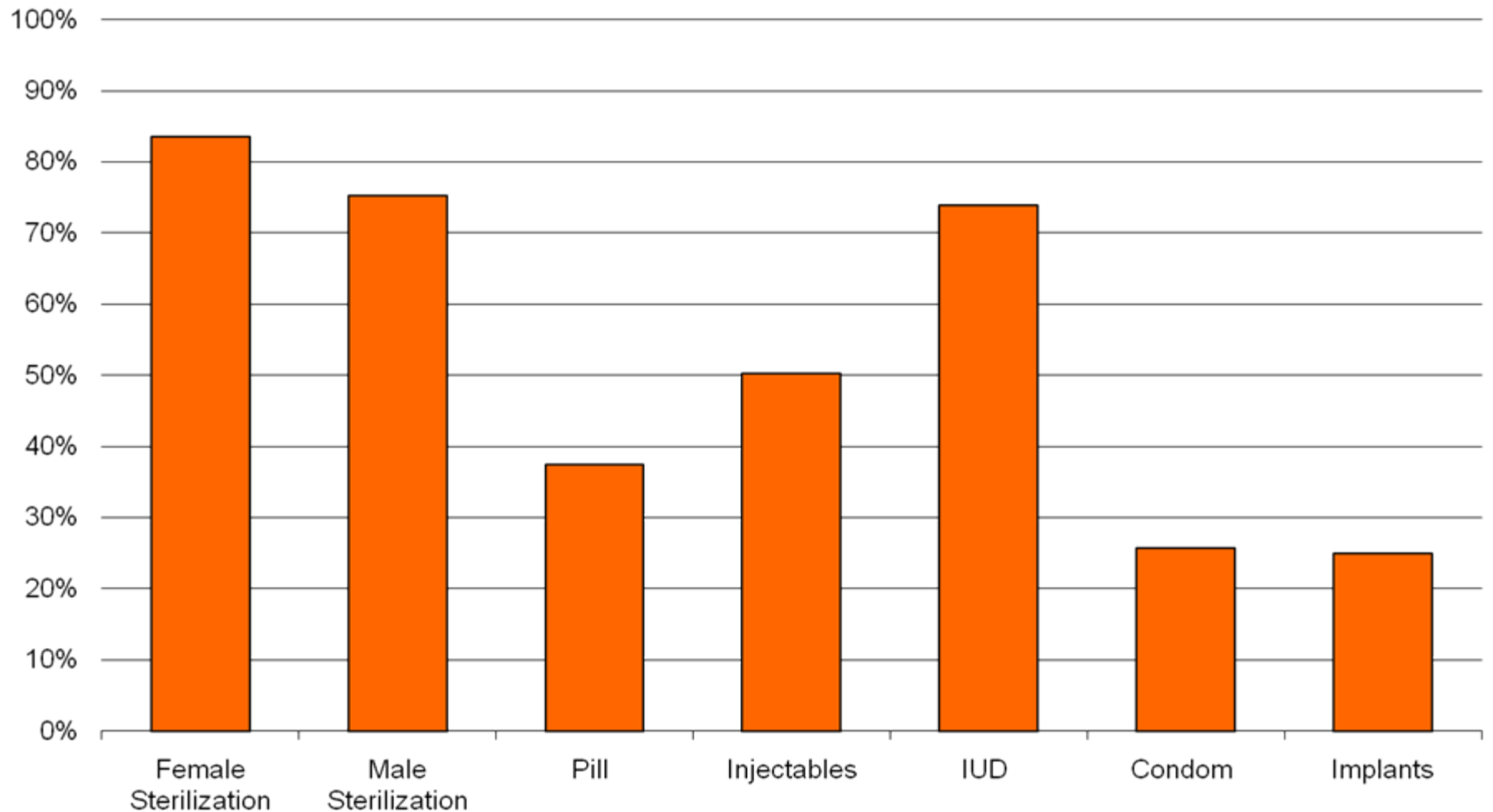
**Figure 4. Projected Number of Contraceptive Users,

Figure 8. Patterns in Contraceptive Supply, 1997–2007, in US\$ Thousands

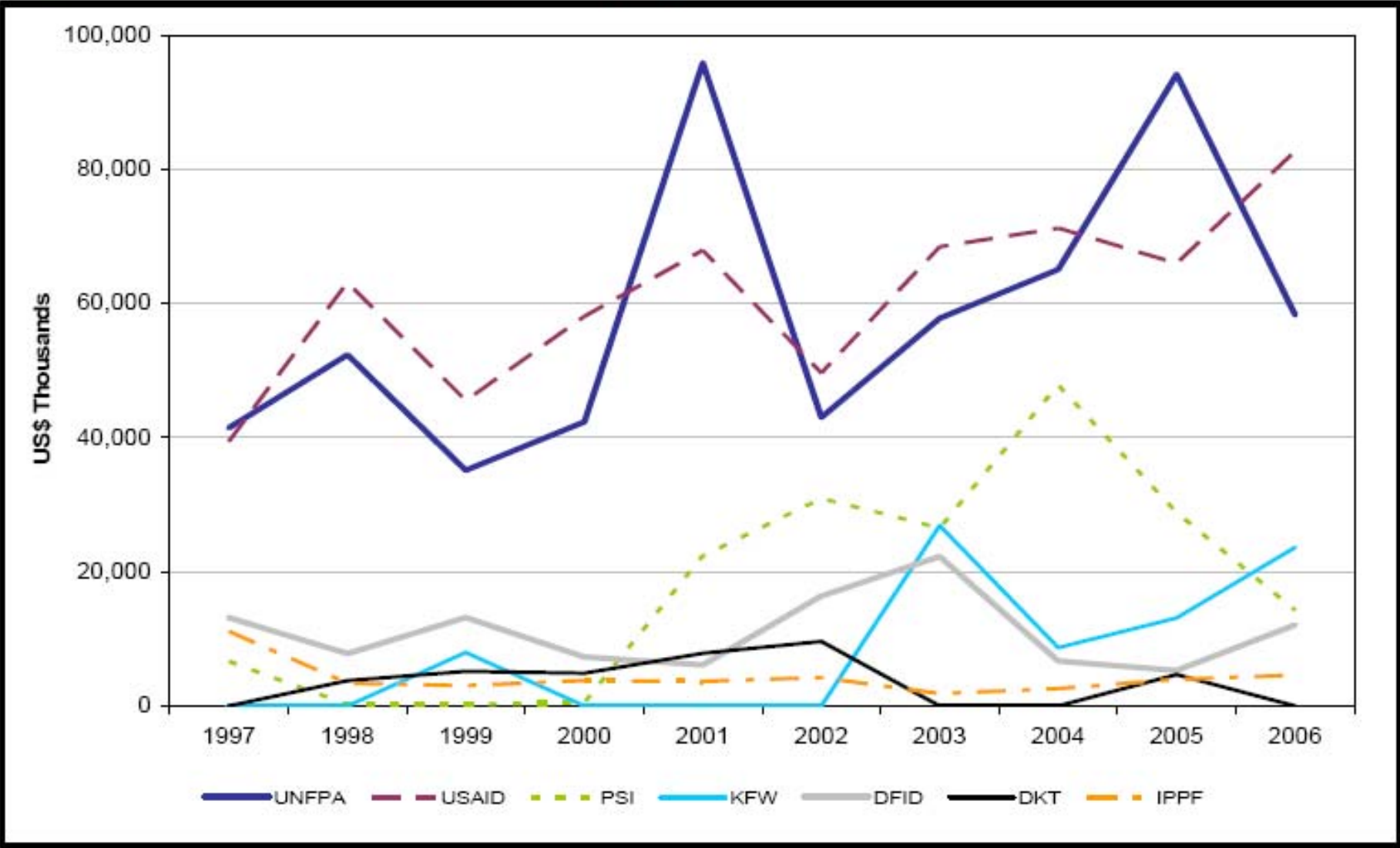


Figure 9. Historical Trends in Donor Financing for Commodities, 1990–2007, and Projected Need, 2008–2020
